Across fourteen exhibition spaces we take measure of the cultural aspects of size.

In the struggle for power and prestige these are often overstepped to the effect that big things go beyond the scope of the reasonable and become unmanageable. Truly great things are created in collaboration. They retain their sublime lightness and do not cast a long shadow, glowing in divine light instead.
